The Rankin House and its 100 Steps to Freedom hold a special place in our country's history. A National Historic Landmark, it was an important stop on the Underground Railroad through which many slaves escaped

to freedom. The home contains memorabilia of the Rankin family and has a breathtaking view of the Ohio River.
